

QUICK LESSON 2 10th JULY 2020

In lesson 1 we learned the d dud d strum

Using the chord boxes from lesson 1 we will now move on to the Riff.

There are 2 initial ways of playing the Riff, easy option and a bit more advanced. Both are valid and add to the overall sound when we play together.

We will learn easy option firstly, then I will move on to the more advanced option for those who want to play it or if you are ready to push yourself. The eventual aim is that both will be played at the same time, some playing the easy one and others playing the more advanced one.

As is the convention Riffs are laid out as TAB

Both of these Riffs are played in place of the last 2 chords that we have learned. That is the C and the G in the chord chart from week 1

I suggest initially learning the easy Riff initially before going on to the more advanced one.

Play the Chords from lesson 1 and replace the last 2 chords with the Riff.

Remember we are using the strumming pattern learned on week 1
